ACTION TAKEN (2020-21)

IQAC Meeting was held on 20-08-2020, 22-12-2020, and 25-3-2021 in the Management's chamber, and a core team was constituted with the Principal, representatives from the Management, the heads of the departments, and other IQAC members. The team met several times. A detailed plan was drawn to gather inputs from diverse groups of science, humanities, alumni, non-teaching staff, library, sports, NSS, NCC, Scouts and Guides, Cultural Committee, Red Cross, Career and Counseling Cell, Science Forum, Women Redressal Cell, Committee against Sexual Harassment Cell, Students Grievance Cell, etc. An action was drafted as per the priorities. Departmental plans were evolved.

COVID-19 affected the academic calendar. The State and Central Government opted for a lockdown many times during the academic year to safeguard the health of the students and other stakeholders.

The Pandemic led to the nationwide lockdown in March 2020. Our faculty immediately shifted to online teaching though it was new to both faculty and students; our faculty made sincere efforts to master the mechanics of the same. A training program on online teaching was organized, and teachers honed their skills by using Zoom App and Google meet. The principal monitored each online class and instructed the students on the importance of attending online classes.

Our College Launched **a YouTube** channel to help the students find educational videos uploaded by our teachers. It was a perfect educational tool to bring a diversity of content to teaching and added a new dimension to education by making it innovative and creative.

Exams were conducted for final-year students, and for the first and second-year students, exams were waived off due to the pandemic.

Our students could explain the experiments in simple language so that rural high school students could comprehend better and overcome their stage fright. Drawing plans, gathering information, dividing the work and duties, making the models, making a perfect team, and exhibiting at the exhibition was a learning experience for the teaching, non-teaching staff and students.
- An online survey was conducted on sustainable development based on the uses of solar energy.
- Short films 'A Chairy Tale', 'Two', 'The Lunch Date', and 'Red Baloon' were screened and followed by a discussion. Films help students to interpret visual texts and appreciate the beauty of the cinematic language that tells some of our most powerful cultural stories.
- The free food kits were distributed to non-teaching staff by the members of office bearers and faculty of Kalpataru Vidya Samsthe during the Pandemic.
- Students and faculty visited Old Age Home and presented UPS.
- A unique programme was conducted for the teaching and non-teaching staff on International Women's Day. Several indoor games were conducted for them, and prizes were given away to the winners. The invigorating event was filled with fun and laughter. Dr.Saraswathi, Principal of GFGC, Tiptur was the chief guest.

- 1) Discussion on the process of Online classes due to COVID -19
- Many teachers and students found it challenging to adapt to virtual classroom teaching
 and preferred traditional classroom teaching. However, both the teachers and students
 adapted to the online learning environment. The faculty made videos and sent them to
 students. Many students did not have a strong internet connection; as a result, they could
 not attend the classes.
- The Principal requested the teachers to understand the students' problems and solve them with empathy. Prof. Veeranna said that once a week, there is an interactive class in the department of Kannada. He said that he had given the students an opportunity for interaction, and they could ask any question about the syllabus.
- Prof. M. B. Shylaja informed the Principal that the feedback was obtained from the final year students, and they were satisfied with online classes. She said teachers from the department of chemistry were taking attendance also. She opined that those who were irregular to the classes were personally contacted on the phone.
- The Principal suggested adopting a participatory approach to engage students in the teaching-learning process to make virtual classroom teaching enjoyable.
- The coordinator opined that teachers become irrelevant unless they embrace new technologies and adopt them in teaching.

The Secretary brought to the notice of the teachers about the recent UGC guidelines that state the HEIs should be allowed to teach 40% of each course through online mode and the remaining 60% in offline mode. He informed that UGC is drafting a "blended model of teaching and learning" concept in colleges and universities.
